

Instead of repeating the same hymn to bide time, the choir may chant other psalmic verses or a slow alleluia. 


<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Appending a long, elaborate alleluia to the brief psalmic verse of the communion hymn was a practice prevalent in the pre-Koukouzelian era. However, the more ancient practice (which encouraged congregational participation) was to chant a complete psalm with brief, pendant alleluias after each verse. (Vid.
